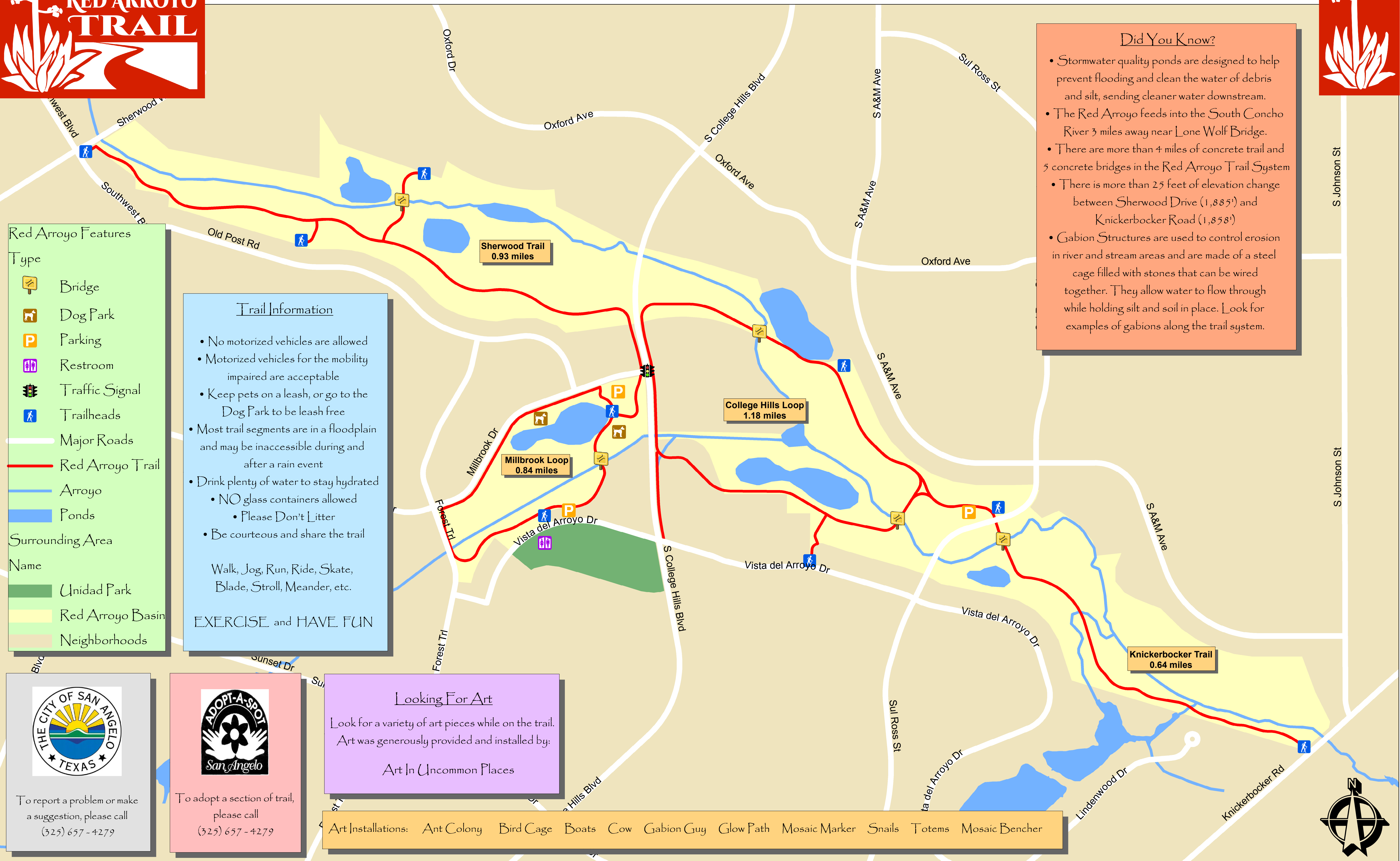
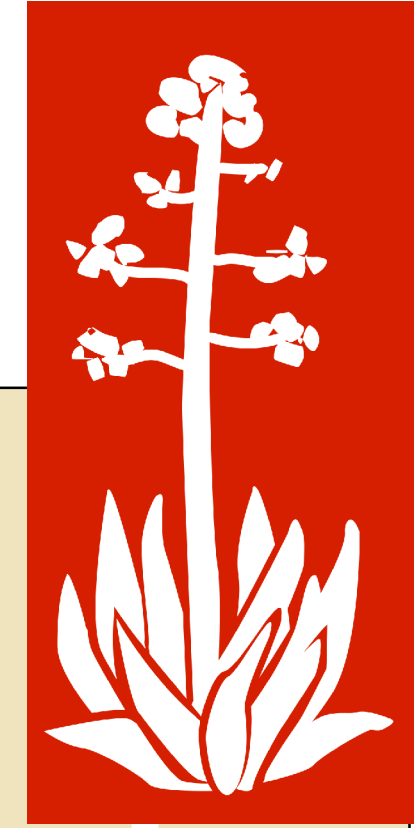




# Red Arroyo Trail

**Trail Information**

- No motorized vehicles are allowed
- Motorized vehicles for the mobility impaired are acceptable
- Keep pets on a leash, or go to the Dog Park to be leash free
- Most trail segments are in a floodplain and may be inaccessible during and after a rain event
- Drink plenty of water to stay hydrated
  - NO glass containers allowed
  - Please Don't Litter
- Be courteous and share the trail

**Did You Know?**

- Stormwater quality ponds are designed to help prevent flooding and clean the water of debris and silt, sending cleaner water downstream.
- The Red Arroyo feeds into the South Concho River 3 miles away near Lone Wolf Bridge.
- There are more than 4 miles of concrete trail and 5 concrete bridges in the Red Arroyo Trail System
- There is more than 25 feet of elevation change between Sherwood Drive (1,885') and Knickerbocker Road (1,858')
- Gabion Structures are used to control erosion in river and stream areas and are made of a steel cage filled with stones that can be wired together. They allow water to flow through while holding silt and soil in place. Look for examples of gabions along the trail system.
