Re: Grant Application and Agreement Execution Procedures

In the past few weeks, it has come to our attention that many departments are not following the procedures outlined in the budget ordinance related to grants. Below is an excerpt from the budget ordinance regarding grants:

...the estimated revenue and expenditure amounts for the grants listed [on the next page] are included (when amounts could be estimated) in the proposed budget, and the City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to apply for those grants. **This authorization extends to application only.** Authorization to execute grant agreements is retained by the City Council, unless specifically delegated in other Council action.

All agreements to receive funding from another organization must be authorized by the City Council. Unless specifically approved by City Council, staff does not have the authority to approve grant agreements. If a new agreement must be signed each year, the agreement must be authorized each year by City Council.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SAN ANGELO, ADOPTING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 2008, AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 2009.

WHEREAS, heretofore, a proposed budget for the fiscal year beginning October 1, 2008, and ending September 30,2009, has been submitted by the City Manager to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been examined and reviewed by the City Council of the City of San Angelo; and

WHEREAS, notice of public hearing upon this budget has been posted and published in accordance with applicable law; and

WHEREAS, the proposed budget has been filed with the City Clerk more than thirty (30) days immediately prior to the public hearing upon said budget; and

WHEREAS, after a full and final consideration of the financial condition and comparative revenues and expenditures as filed and after the public hearing upon such budget, it is the consensus of opinion that the budget as filed and amended should be approved.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, OF THE CITY OF SAN ANGELO, TEXAS, that:

<u>Section One</u>: That the budget as filed and amended for the fiscal year October 1, 2008, to September 30, 2009, is hereby approved and adopted and constitutes the general appropriation authorization for the 2008-2009 fiscal year.

Items contained and approved as part of the budget are as follows:

Authoritative Sections: These are the portions of the greater document that are being approved by Council for implementation in the subject year.

- Financial Summaries contains summary revenue and expenditure information proposed for the subject fiscal year. The City Council is authorizing the amounts in this section as the City's budget. A one page summary of this information is attached as Exhibit A.
- Competitive Pay Plan contains the Pay Schedule (grade and step table) for all City employees. The City Council is authorizing employee compensation schedules in accordance with this information. A three page summary of this information is attached as Exhibit B.

Non-authoritative Sections: There are portions of the greater document that have been included to facilitate analysis and to be a reference source as Council deliberated the Budget. They are not being approved as authoritative documents.

<u>Section Two</u>: That all expenditures of the City of San Angelo shall be made in accordance with the summary budget approved by this ordinance provided however:

- 1) The City Council may amend this ordinance to authorize changes that increase the total appropriation of any fund.
- 2) The City Manager or his or her designee is authorized to approve changes that move budget amounts between accounts within a fund. The City Manager is also authorized to approve changes that move budget amounts between accounts in different funds that have in common the same City service or operation.
- 3) The City Manager is authorized to implement a "vacancy rate" which allows him to freeze budgeted payroll moneys associated with unfilled positions.
- 4) The City Manager is authorized to approve budget amendments that reduce the total amount of budgeted revenues and expenditures in a fund. Under this authorization the reduction in budgeted expenses must equal or exceed any reduction in budgeted revenues.

<u>Section Three</u>: That the estimated revenue and expenditure amounts for the grants listed in <u>Exhibit C</u> are included (when amounts could be estimated) in the proposed budget, and the City Manager or his designee is hereby authorized to apply for those grants. This authorization extends to application only. Authorization to execute grant agreements is retained by the City Council, unless specifically delegated in other Council action.
