VIII. Possible reconsideration of incentive funding for a project for a non-profit organization at 1720 Martin Luther King Drive.

Mr. Fox went over the project with the following:

Funding Requested: \$71,845 Match: \$15,768 (18%) Total Project Cost: \$87,613

Recommended Incentive Award (if deemed appropriate): \$71,845

Summary of Work: Paving, Façade improvements, lighting

Non-profit organizations may be eligible for TIRZ incentives in the North zone if the TIRZ Board
and City Council make a finding that a <u>significant economic impact will be created as a result
of the project</u>. Providing funding for a non-profit organization under this policy shall require a
favorable vote of at least <u>three-fourths</u> of all the members <u>all</u> of the TIRZ Board and City
Council.

Public comment was made by the applicant, Ms. Smith, Mr. Boone, and Mr. Myers.

Mr. Villarreal made a motion to approve and seconded by Mr. Maurer. Motion passed 7 to 1 with Mr. Brown opposed.

IX. Discussion, direction, and possible action on moving the boundary between the North and South TIRZ areas

Mr. James presented the following:

- During recent discussions on how to distribute TIRZ funds, a suggestion was made to reconsider the boundary between the North and South TIRZ areas.
- At their meeting on December 13, 2022, the City Council directed staff to place this item on the agenda for the TIRZ Board seeking input and a recommendation on this possible change

Public comments were made by Mr. Myers, Ms. Smith, Mr. Velasquez, and Mr. Pfluger.

Mr. Brown made a motion to reject moving the boundary. The motion was seconded by Mr. Villarreal and the motion passed unanimously.

X. Discussion, direction, and possible action on amending the TIRZ Incentive Policy to remove funding eligibility for property owned by a non-profit organization

Mr. James opened the discussion and answered the board's questions on this item.

Public comments were by Mr. Myers, Mr. Pfluger, and Ms. Smith.

Mr. Brown made a motion to keep non-profit eligibility. The motion was seconded by Mr. Villarreal. The motion passed 5 to 3 with Mr. Fernandez, Mr. Benson, and Mr. Newlin being opposed.

Mr. Hogg would like a future agenda item to discuss having the same policy for Non-Profits in the North and South.
