Mr. Fernandez made a motion to approve 820 N. Chadbourne with the recommended amount. Seconded by Mr. Benson and the motion passed unanimously

Mr. Villarreal made a motion to approve 2901 N. Chadbourne with the recommended amount. Seconded by Mr. Brown and the motion passed unanimously

Mr. Villarreal made a motion to approve 1100 M.L.K with the following modifications to meet landscaping on the paving area that can be added to the project's individual cost. Seconded by Mr. Brown and the motion passed unanimously
