I. Call to order, establish quorum.

The meeting was called to order at 12:05 pm. It was established that a quorum was present.

II. Public comment.

Ms. Nora Regino introduced Sarah Tackett as the new Sr. Administrative Assistant for Development Services. Ms. Regino also introduced new board member, Dominique Santos.

Mr. Jerry Sea inquired about an Expenditure Report for North TIRZ and questioned if any money that had been loaned out had been repaid?

Mr. Schneeman told Mr. Sea to come by his office to discuss issue and receive a copy of the report.

Mr. Patrick Howard introduced himself; explained that the divisions had been split. He is looking forward to some strategic planning and working with the TIRZ Board.

III. Consideration of approving the minutes from the February 26, 2014 meeting.

Motion was made to accept the minutes, with a correction to the date and time adjourned, by William Dendle, seconded by Mike Campbell and carried unanimously.

IV. Review and consideration of the March 2014 financial reports.

Mr. Schneeman presented the March 2014 financial report; no property tax income is shown for the downtown zone. Mr. Schneeman stated that there have been some problems with money from the county; COSA Finance

Department is working on this issue. An overview of the revenues were also presented.

VI. Update, presentation, discussion and possible action regarding the North TIRZ Streetscape projects.

Mr. Schneeman gave a brief overview of the North TIRZ Streetscape projects; this includes two grants. Dates and deadlines were explained to the board. Concho Valley Transit District (CVTD) is working on the RFQ for a Design/Build Contract to allow for construction to begin while still in the design phase. This is the best way to accelerate the project to meet deadlines. It is recommended that this project run concurrently with another project on 12<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> Streets; funded by a grant to CVTD.

Mr. Craig Kinney questioned if timeframe is reasonable; Mr. Schneeman stated staff is optimistic, it is doable. Mr. Mike Campbell asked what risks are involved with proceeding with Design/Build? Mr. Bob Schneeman stated that there is the possibility of more change orders. Mr. Michael Noret stated he was very use to this process; it is very straight forward.

- V) Consideration and approval of funding to contract a Design/Build consultant to oversee the New Freedom Grant Project (North Chadbourne Streetscape from 7<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> Street).
- VI) Consideration of funding decorative street and pedestrian lighting for the New Freedom Grant Project (North Chadbourne Streetscape from 7<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> Street).

## SUMMARY

- V) The New Freedom Grant Project (North Chadbourne Streetscape from 7th to 14th Street) was originally approved by the TIRZ Board in 2011. A cash match in the amount of \$57,869, described in a letter written by Shawn Lewis dated November 29, 2011. This money was initially the 20% match and allocated for engineering services that were to be completed by the City of San Angelo Engineering staff. Since that initial letter the FTA agreement, more specifically Attachment A, has been approved by the TIRZ board in the amount of \$68,777 as the local match in funds for this project, with a total of \$275,108 allocated by the grant itself. In the previous month, CVTD, along with the COSA Engineering staff has revisited this project to determine what steps need to be taken to expedite this project to final completion, while maintaining the funding source already in place. The limited time constraints that this project is now under, completion date of May 2015, requires a change in scope and design feasibility. The Texas Department of Transportation granted COSA a one year extension, with no exceptions. Staff would recommend approval to contract a Design/Build Consultant, which would have the ability to oversee all aspects of design and construction, making the issue of unforeseen existing ADA accessibility obstacles a continual goal. alleviating the loss of funding due to not meeting the completion date.
- VI) The need for proper pedestrian lighting is a concern staff would like the board to consider and give clear direction, regarding funding. The New Freedom Grant Project (North Chadbourne Streetscape from 7<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> Street) does not have funding to install the proposed lighting for the project. When the public meetings were held in 2010 and 2011, citizens were told this project would be constructed to match the existing amenities of the previous Chadbourne Project at 19<sup>th</sup> Street that included decorative street and pedestrian lighting. Specific questions were asked, with noted replies distinctly related to this particular lighting. An approximate dollar amount to install lights on this project is \$500,000.

However, future alternatives exist if the funds are not available to install the lighting during construction. During construction, both sides of Chadbourne from 7<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> will be cleared from property line to the edge of pavement,

allowing for electrical conduit to be installed. This option will allow for future cost savings and considerable reduction to future construction and demo of the completed project. An estimated cost to facilitate the installation of electrical conduit for this project is approximately \$30,000. Currently, the Westside of Chadbourne Street has street lighting only on the corners, mounted to timber poles. The Eastside of Chadbourne does have some random street lighting on timber poles.
